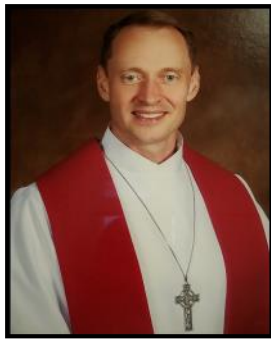

*From the pen
of Pastor Mark*

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Just around the corner we begin the 40-day journey of Lent together, starting with Ash Wednesday worship at noon and 7:30 pm on March 2nd. You can also sign up for soup supper March 2nd at 6 pm before worship. In Lent, we take time to reflect on the great depth of love our Lord has given to us, intentionally choosing a journey that will lead ultimately to the cross with pain, suffering, and death. In John 15:13 Jesus says, "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends." This saying, this mantra, became a reality for Christ Jesus, who followed through with what he preached and taught, loving us to the end of life itself....and beyond. So we come into Lent marveling and wondering at the great depth of love God has for us, to send His only begotten Son to live with us, teach us, heal us, walk with us, die for us, and rise for us all.

As in previous years, we will also have weekly noon Lenten services at Holy Trinity, which will be somewhat short and reflective by intention. These will also be on video to watch later in the day or evening as well if you can't attend at noon. This year our theme will be love. In addition to focus on the Psalm from the previous Sunday, each weekly worship will also focus on a section of 1st Corinthians 13 (Paul's chapter on love), so that through the course of our 5 mid-week services we will cover this chapter fully, one section at a time. Our hope in Lent is to draw ever closer to our Lord, and as we explore Paul's chapter on love, perhaps we can enter more deeply in Christian love with each other and with the one who in love gave himself for us all.

Back by request we begin Brown Bag Lunch with the Pastor in March, meeting in the Upper Room each 2nd and 4th Wednesday. During Lenten mid-week worship services, we will meet in the Upper Room following worship (probably around 12:45 pm). After Lent we will resume meeting each 2nd and 4th Wednesday at noon through May. All are welcome and you can come with absolutely any theological/life question or topic, or come just to hang out together for lunch.

We also have opportunities to put our love into action this Lent, including our Dig Deep Appalachia Water Project, a new Habitat build on Saturdays, and hosting the Grand View University Choir on March 16th for our 6 pm congregational potluck and 7:30 pm Celtic Service. Descriptions and sign-up sheets for these and more opportunities for putting love into action are available in the Fellowship Hall.

Whatever you choose as a spiritual discipline and whether you omit something or add something for Lent, may it be for the purpose of drawing you closer to our Lord Jesus Christ. Also, consider going for something you intend to continue after Lent, so that your spiritual discipline during Lent isn't just a short-term focus, but an opportunity for growth and transformation in Christ's love.

As we journey through Lent together, may God's love shine in our hearts and God's light emanate through us.

We are now entering the next phase of our "Stewardship for All Seasons" program and embarking on the development of a long-term Planned Giving and Endowment Program. Therefore, we are working to provide resources to our members about Estate Planning. 2022 Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Lenten Water Project



Our donation focus for God's Work-Our Hands during this Lenten season is running water for citizens in Appalachia.

March 2 (Ash Wednesday) through April 17 (Easter Sunday)

Why donate to Dig Deep's Appalachia Water Project?

100% of your donations go directly to the Appalachia Water Project. We want to help those needy families whose running water is cloudy, dirty, and unfit to drink and who sometimes shower after a downpour by standing under a gutter.

- Dig Deep field projects always establish local water councils: groups of 8-10 locals who care for a new water source. Their input and decision-making ensure each project's long-term sustainability.
- McDowell County in West Virginia experienced a drastic drop in population between 1950 and the most recent census: from 100,000 in coal mining's heyday in 1950 to 17,600 in 2010. No more coal mining support for their water systems, a drastic drop in their tax base, and a drop in federal dollars for supporting community water systems provided the perfect storm for a lack of running water and septic systems.
- Dig Deep's immediate help for these people in need is to provide Hydropanels, a special type of solar panels that create water from sunlight and air by using solar energy to draw water out of the air. Those panels provide 117 liters of clean, free water available to the local people for pick up. Soon, Dig Deep will provide water systems like those they are providing for the Navajos so that people will have running water.

Here's who welcomes you just outside the entrance of the Ronald McDonald house near Children's Healthcare of Atlanta/Scottish Rite .

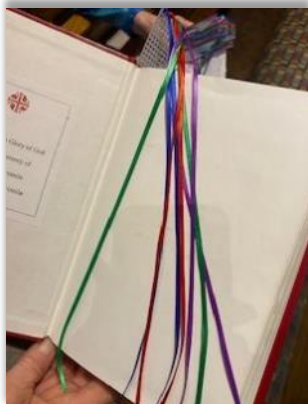

We can also just enjoy having lunch together too.

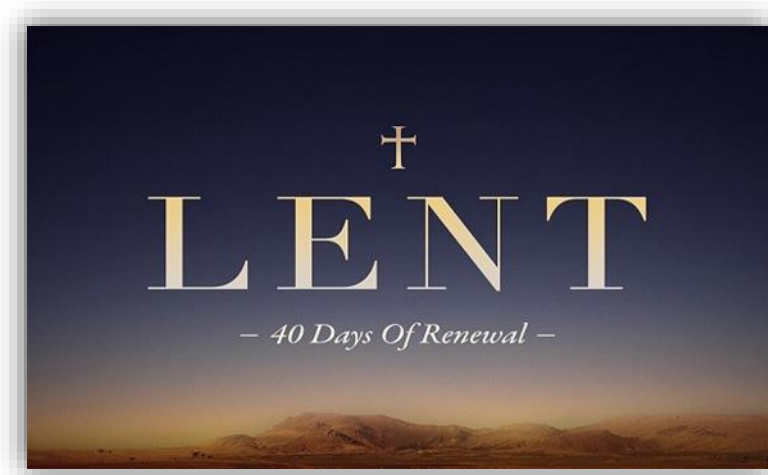
