Dear Family of God at Holy Trinity,

Sometimes when it rains it pours. Only 10 days after a horrific mass shooting in Buffalo, over double the number of people were killed in Texas on May 24th, including so many innocent elementary school children. In times like this we may question not only individual troubled souls who lash out, but perhaps humanity itself. What has happened? A couple generations ago guns were on the back of pick-up trucks, in homes, in marksman courses at school, and various other places. Knives were commonplace too. In other words, there were many easily accessible lethal weapons available. But why in those times did intense anger often lead to perhaps a fist fight and not even a thought of picking up a gun?

So many layers may contribute, including a watering down and turning away from faith, as well as the same in terms of values, morals, and sense of responsibility as neighbor, as citizen, and as a fellow child of God. Clearly some things have changed. Yet in broader terms considering world history, our human species hasn't often had extended periods of deep, abiding peace. In fact, throughout our history when these times of "peace" have come they tend to be more the exception than the norm.

Although current times do have some objective indicators that could easily earn the label "worse" than in times past, our broad human history reminds us, as we profess in our confession, that we are "captive to sin, and cannot free ourselves." When God created us, God declared us and all God's creation as "good." We still have this good in us. But we also turned away from God, in what we call "original sin" and have been battling, bloodying, and beating each other and ourselves ever since then. We are truly saint and sinner, simultaneously. Sometimes one battling side wins out over the other. Left to our own, it's hopeless. The answer is that we need God. Perhaps now more than ever. This is not because our nature is worse than before. But in these times, we as a society have allowed faith to be watered down, and we have turned away not only from God directly, but also from the faithful living of values that come from God, such as being good Samaritans, loving God first, and loving our neighbors as ourselves. Without the foundation of these values of love, it only makes sense that humanity's struggle of saint and sinner leans more and more heavily to sin, and more harshly so as well.

There's a saying to fight fire with fire. In some cases, such as getting a fire to burn itself out and not spread further, this is true. But let's be real. Most cases call for water, not more fire! This means fighting hate with love, fighting killing with life, fighting division with unity, fighting narcissistic self-focus with heartfelt focus on God. This means fighting the scorching flames of sin with the Spirit-anointed waters of baptism. The answer is God, and God's love.

So in the midst of all this, may the peace of Christ which passes all human understanding be with you all. Remember the words of Christ from a recent worship: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid" (John 14:27). Evil has not yet been fully overcome on earth. More will come from around us, and yes, also from within us. But the Lord our God is with us, and His steadfast love endures forever. Now is the time to receive this grace, this peace, this unity, this inheritance as family of God, and share it with the world. Let's fight fire with water!

A Message from Your Stewardship Ministry Team:

Have You Considered Including Holy Trinity in Your Will?

Have you considered what will happen to your assets after you pass on and go to heaven? Do you have a great love for Holy Trinity or another charity and want to create a sustainable mission for them long into the future? Sadly, 70% of estate plans fail to pay out the way the donor intended. There are so many complexities to what will be probated and how much money it costs to probate and what assets are best for family and loved ones.

Creating a comprehensive charitable estate plan means ensuring you are providing for family and loved ones while leaving a planned gift to a charity or faith community you care about. It can get complicated and overwhelming.

To support our church members, the Stewardship Team is currently working with Pastor Ana Lugo, Regional Planner for the ELCA Foundation for the development of a comprehensive Endowment Program. Our Church Council has already approved in March, a formal Gift Policy as the first step in preparation for this Endowment Program. Our goal is to make it easy to include Holy Trinity in a portion of your Will to help continue our Ministries here for many years to come.

Our plan is to host a Free Planned Giving Workshop toward the end of the Summer for those interested in learning more about the process of creating a comprehensive charitable estate plan. During the workshop you will learn about the realities of what it means to say "I am including you in my Will." The focus will be on which assets are probated and which are not. On what assets have tax and other implications for family and loved ones and how to leave the best assets to the best beneficiaries in the best ways.

We sent out a survey to the congregation earlier this year on this topic and many responded being interested in participating in this workshop.

So...Stay tuned for more upcoming information and dates for the Workshop as we continue to develop a formal Endowment Program for Holy Trinity.

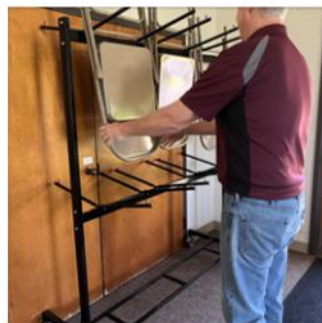

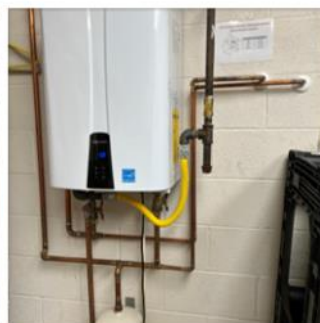

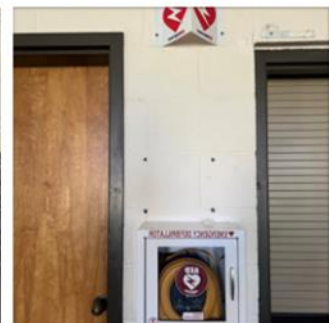

**Can you commit to 90-120 minutes, once a month,
in meaningful service?**

The Hospitality Committee provides coffee and goodies following each of our Sunday Worship Services.

For the 8:30 service, working in pairs, we arrive at church 45 minutes before the worship service and make the coffee, prepare the tables, and plate the refreshments that have already been set out, cover them, and place them on a rolling cart. We're then able to attend worship. After communion, we return to the kitchen and wheel the cart to the table, where we place the plates on the table, and uncover them. About thirty minutes later, we bring the plates back to the kitchen, wash and dry the plates and tidy up as necessary.

For the 11:00 service, we arrive at church by 10:15 and consult with first service workers and follow the same set-up procedure, attending worship, returning to the kitchen after receiving communion and wheeling out the prepared foods. About 30 minutes later, we bring the dishes back to the kitchen for clean-up. We're usually able to leave by 1:00.

Coffee Fellowship requires two people for each service – two services each Sunday, four services per month, for a total of 16 volunteers. Currently we have 11. Unless we get 5 more volunteers, male or female, to join our committee before August 1st, we may have to discontinue Coffee Fellowship. 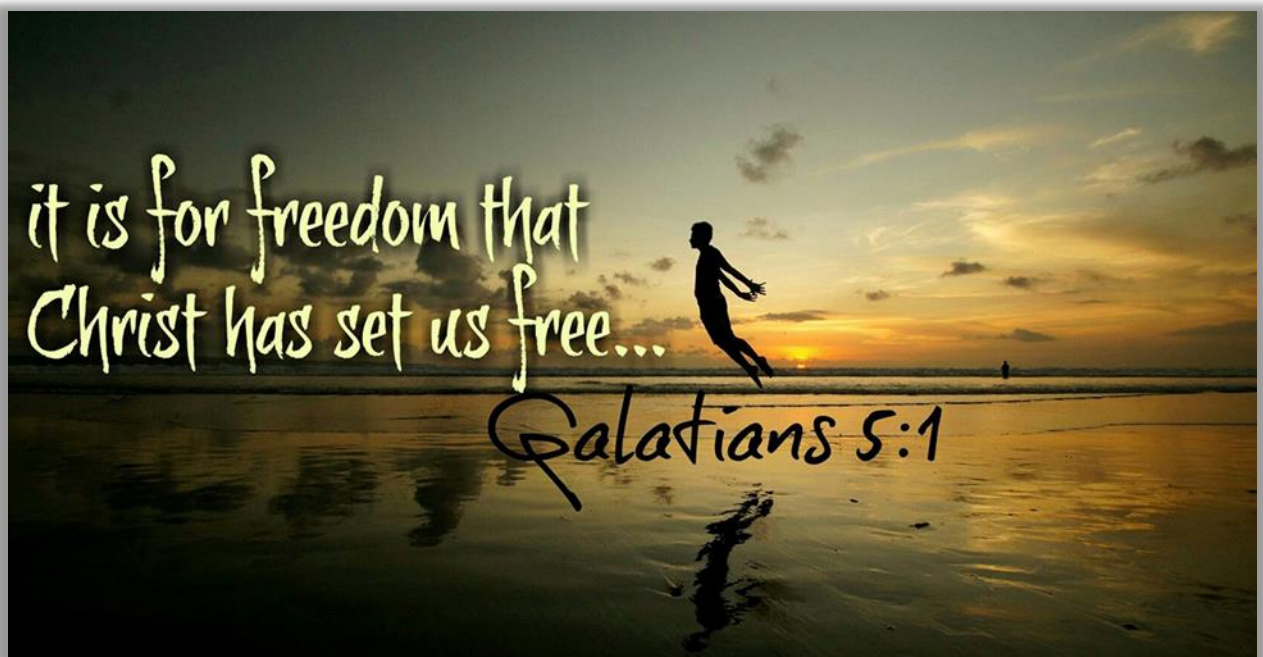
