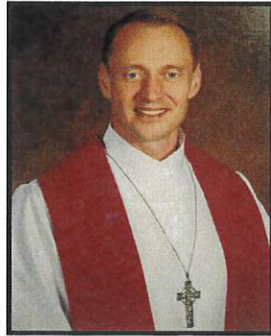

From the pen of Pastor Mark

Dear Family of God at Holy Trinity,

Thanks so much for your faithful service to our Lord this Lenten season. We raised over \$4,000 for Hunger Walk, gave faithfully to the Dig Deep Water Fund, worked on our Habitat House (we still have April 2nd and 23rd to go, so it's not too late to help!), graciously hosted our guests from Grand View University Choir at our Celtic Service on March 16th, and reached out in so many ways to each other and to the world in Christ-like service and love this Lent.

Now we approach Holy Week. As of this writing, COVID cases remain super-low compared to the start of the year in January. With this, I invite you to come experience the mystery, wonder, and awe of worshipping the Lord together as we approach Easter. Come if you can in person to gather together as the connected body of Christ with the Holy Spirit in our midst. However, if you can't make it or don't yet feel fully safe, we will continue our worship services online and will be the gathered body of Christ together no matter how close or far apart we are physically. God is greater than any distance. Still, for those of us who are able, there is depth and mystery and connection to being together physically in worship. Come as you are able!

Maundy Thursday at 7:30 pm on April 14th we celebrate Holy Communion and also witness the stripping of the altar as we prepare for what's to come on Good Friday.

On Good Friday at 8:00 pm on April 15th we remember the 7 last words of Christ in our Tenebrae service, as the worship space slowly darkens throughout the worship.

On Saturday at 5:30 pm on April 16th our Modern Worship celebrates the Easter Vigil service, which for us begins with the Vigil and moves into Easter itself for our Saturday worshipers. Like the Tenebrae service on Good Friday, this transition from Vigil to Easter is unique to Holy Trinity and something you likely won't experience the same way in other local churches.

Then on Sunday at 8:30 am and 11:00 am we celebrate Easter with full fanfare and joy! Yes, there's a special "A" word that will return on Easter to be proclaimed, shouted, and sung again! Also, come to our Easter Breakfast in between the services starting around 9:30 am or soon after.

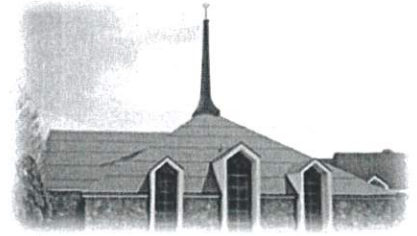
We have so many reasons to come worship God in thanksgiving and in prayer. We have reason for joy and love; and yet need for healing and peace. Worship is not just the foundation of what we do, it's also a foundation of who we are. So let's come hold up palm branches on April 10th, celebrate Communion on Thursday, remember the cross on Friday, make the turn of Vigil to Easter on Saturday, and celebrate the risen Lord together on Sunday!

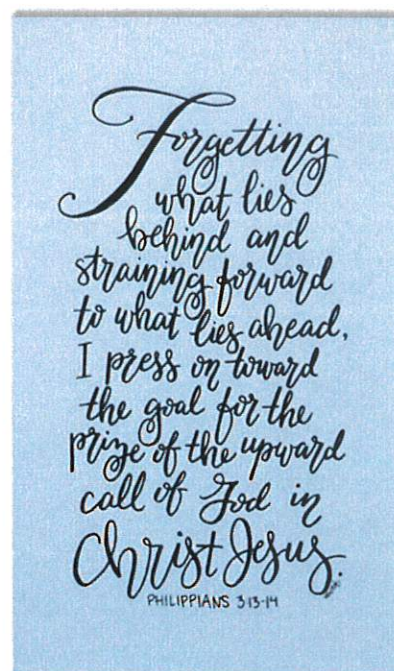

A Message from Your Stewardship Ministry Team:

Council Approves a Holy Trinity Gift Policy...

As we begin the development of an Endowment Program to help sustain Holy Trinity for many years to come, we had to first develop and implement a Gift Policy which helps to define and guide donors and staff in the administration of such gifts. In developing the policy we remember that all acts of generosity and sharing what God has first given us are always welcome and all offer donors that special relationship of commitment and closeness with the church and our congregation regardless of the types of gifts donors may offer us.

The primary purpose of this policy is to ensure that all gifts to the church can be used to benefit our church, our congregation, and our community as quickly and efficiently as possible. Other types of gifts, such as real estate, could require expertise and administration that would draw resources away from our mission activities. During research, we found that many churches already have a written gift policy prompting us to do so as well. The church believes that leadership and staff should be primarily focused on their work in the mission field and, while all gifts are welcome and very much appreciated, gifts that require ongoing administration or complex transactions may draw the church's time and energy away from our mission focus.

Therefore, this Policy has been designed to provide guidance and assistance both to donors and to HTLC staff in handling gifts to the church which may require expertise and administration over and above what is necessary for more "typical" gifts such as cash or stocks and bonds.

The purpose of this Policy is therefore to provide written guidance and processes both to donors and church staff on how to approach proposed gifts to determine the best way to structure such gifts so that they can be quickly and efficiently applied to the work and activities of our various missions.

This Policy also addresses the differences between restricted and unrestricted gifts. While the church will always honor the wishes of donors who place restrictions on the use of their gifts, it may at times be necessary to consider the practical implications of some restrictions to determine whether such restrictions can realistically accomplish the donor's intent.

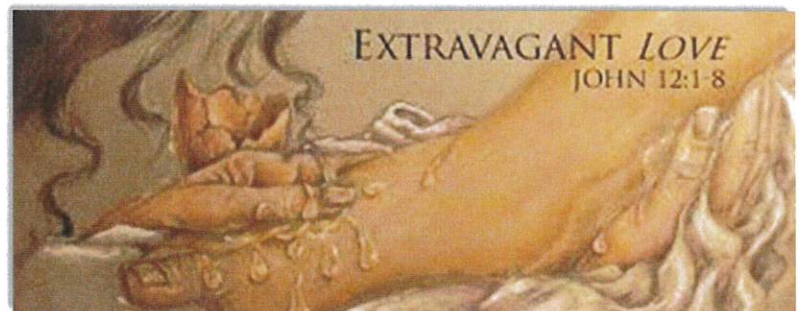
Therefore, we are in the process of establishing an Endowments and Gifts Committee reporting to the Finance Committee. Their purpose will be to review and make recommendations to the HTLC Council concerning gifts which present special considerations and management prior to the acceptance of the gifts.

We are pleased to report that this Gifts Policy was unanimously approved by the Holy Trinity Church Council on March 20, 2022. For those interested, copies of the policy will be available for review in the church office.

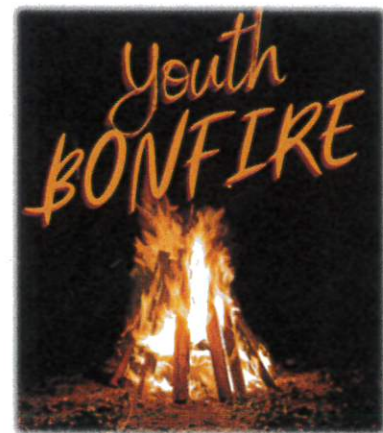

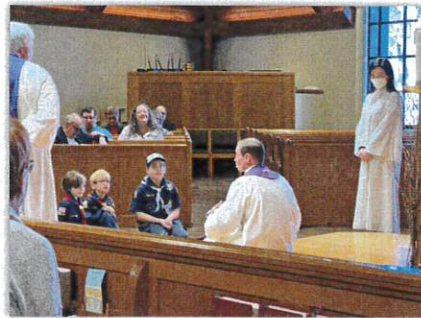
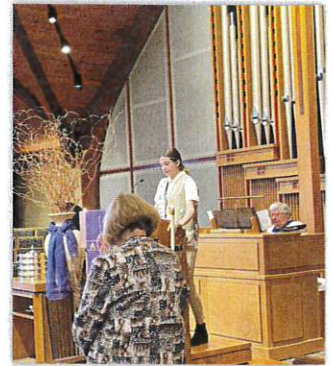

BOT Scholarship

Holy Trinity men's group, Bible on Tap, offers a \$500 annual scholarship to a male high school senior and member of Holy Trinity who intends to pursue a secondary education at a college or technical school.

The successful candidate will receive the scholarship in August prior to beginning his first year of college or technical school. The \$500 scholarship will renew for up to three years thereafter, contingent upon the student's successful completion of the previous academic year and continued full-time enrollment in a degree program.

Interviews will be conducted in May. **Applications must be received in the church office no later than May 1.** Please address the application to "Bible on Tap, Attention Scholarship Committee." The application should contain a summary of the candidate's academic record, high school activities, community activities, and involvement at Holy Trinity.

WELCA Scholarship

Holy Trinity's Women of the ELCA organization will again offer an educational scholarship of \$1,000. It is the intent of this organization to encourage women of all ages to expand their current talents as a Christian and perhaps carry those and newly-learned talents into an area that will enable her to help others know God too.

To be eligible you must be a female member of Holy Trinity who intends to pursue college or technical studies and have graduated from high school. Candidates should write a short one-page essay about their goals, financial need and objectives and include a copy of their most recent transcript. **Application due date is Monday, June 6.**

Let's help Cobb County Foster Children graduates celebrate their big accomplishment!!

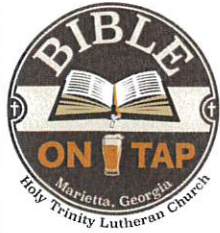

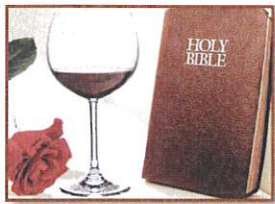
After two long years, Monday School began meeting again in the Upper Room on Monday, March 28th. Lots of hugging, "catching up", and laughter filled the room the entire morning.

2022 Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Lenten Water Project

Our donation focus for God's Work-Our Hands during this Lenten season is running water for citizens in Appalachia.

March 2 (Ash Wednesday) through April 17 (Easter Sunday)

Why donate to Dig Deep's Appalachia Water Project?

100% of your donations go directly to the Appalachia Water Project. We want to help those needy families whose running water is cloudy, dirty, and unfit to drink and who sometimes shower after a downpour by standing under a gutter.

- Dig Deep field projects always establish local water councils: groups of 8-10 locals who care for a new water source. Their input and decision-making ensure each project's long-term sustainability.
- McDowell County in West Virginia experienced a drastic drop in population between 1950 and the most recent census: from 100,000 in coal mining's heyday in 1950 to 17,600 in 2010. No more coal mining support for their water systems, a drastic drop in their tax base, and a drop in federal dollars for supporting community water systems provided the perfect storm for a lack of running water and septic systems.
- Dig Deep's immediate help for these people in need is to provide Hydropanels, a special type of solar panels that create water from sunlight and air by using solar energy to draw water out of the air. Those panels provide 117 liters of clean, free water available to the local people for pick up. Soon, Dig Deep will provide water systems like those they are providing for the Navajos so that people will have running water.
